Having known Chris Nabors for five years, I feel the way that he has been portrayed, publicly, is unjust. To describe him as arrogant and remorseless based on hearsay and appearances is simply invalid. For those of us who saw how sad he was the day after the accident, one could hardly describe his mood as remorseless or uncaring.

Yet, I feel that the decisions which will determine Chris's future will be affected by these subjective opinions. In a high profile case, it is hard to keep subjective opinions from affecting the eventual outcome. It is my hope that you can remain as objective as possible when it comes time for Chris's sentencing.

Chris is not a remorseless person who set out to hurt anyone the night of the tragedy. Chris made a mistake that night as did the woman involved. Both Chris and Michelle were seen drinking that night and both chose to ride in the same car. What followed was a horrible accident that involved only Chris and Michelle.

Statements made by the people at the bar, by the doctors and nurses in the emergency room, by the police, and by the newspaper all reinforce the grave dangers of drinking and driving. But I feel that these statements should not be used to decide Chris's future.
